Job 38-41

1. Kevin opened up his sermon explaining that beneath the story of Job is, “can I trust the character of God?” What’s your response to this question?
2. “But where can wisdom be found? Where does understanding dwell?” -Job 28:12. Where do you look to for wisdom?

6. Some steps we can take to lean into God’s grace were provided, 1. Accept your limitations, 2. Accept the inevitability of suffering, and 3. Trust in God’s grace. Which of these resonate the most with you right now, and how may the group be praying for you to live this out?
7. The sermon concluded with exhorting us that, “God is meeting me in my dust and ashes.” (Job 42:6) What would this look like for you?
