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# Scripture Through the Phases



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## What a kid or teenager believes about God will impact how they see themselves and everybody else.

It will ultimately impact their future. That's why we believe the Bible is an important part of knowing God.

The overall goal for developing faith is to nurture kids into a growing, authentic relationship with God so that they own their faith as they move on into adulthood.

What we help kids learn about God, Jesus, and the Bible is essential. But we must hold that in tension with what we know from developmental psychology. Namely that people process certain types of information better at certain stages of their development. We shouldn't fight against this; rather, we should lean into this.

Knowing when kids and students should learn certain stories and ideas from the Bible is also important. Let's be honest; some heroes of the Bible had moments in their life that would make an adult blush, and though not suitable for a kid, those same stories might be perfect for what a teenager in your church is dealing with.

With that in mind, choose stories and concepts that will be foundational to a child's growing theology at each phase of their life and teach them in ways they can understand and remember.

In this resource, we've included some ideas to help your kids learn Scripture from the Bible, as well as a starter list of some verses for each phase.

We've also included some Scripture memory cards for each phase to help you put these concepts into practice.

### Ideas for Memorizing Scripture: Preschool

Here are some phase-based ideas for memorizing Scripture. We're going for quality, not quantity, here. Take it slow and keep repeating what you want to memorize. Don't move on to another verse too quickly. It's better to set a goal of fewer verses and truly memorize them than set a goal of many verses and forget them over time. It's also important to discuss the verse and what it means.

### Movement

Connect an active motion with a Bible verse (march, hand motions, act it out, etc.).

### **Break It Down**

Learn the verse a few words at a time over a long period of time.

### **Record It**

Record yourself (or a favorite grandparent, aunt, uncle, etc.) saying the Bible verse so your child can listen (watch it) and say it with them. Let your child record themself saying the verse as well. They love hearing their own voice and seeing themselves on video!

#### Repetition

Say it over and over and over and over...

What works for preschoolers, plus...

### Draw It

Drawing the verse helps elementary kids understand the meaning of the verse rather than just memorizing the words.

### Make a Puzzle

Put each word of the verse on a notecard and practice putting the words in order.

#### Write It Out

The good ol' fashion practice of writing the verse over and over still works.

### Hang It

Place the verse in places where the child will see it every day (bathroom mirror, front of the fridge, nightstand, etc.).

### Ideas for Memorizing Scripture: Middle School

Here are some phase-based ideas for memorizing Scripture. We're going for quality, not quantity, here. Take it slow and keep repeating what you want to memorize. Don't move on to another verse too quickly. It's better to set a goal of fewer verses and truly memorize them than set a goal of many verses and forget them over time. It's also important to discuss the verse and what it means.

What works for preschoolers and elementary kids, plus...

### **Highlight It**

Gift your middle schooler with a Bible and some highlighters/colored pencils and challenge them to begin highlighting the verses as they memorize them.

### **Add Your Name**

You can place your name in so many verses to make them even more personal. Challenge your middle schooler to give it a try. Example: John 3:16, "For God so loved [name of middle schooler] that he gave his one and only son..."

### **Verse Over Phone**

When middle schoolers get bored, they mindlessly grab their phone. (Actually, we all do this, don't we?) Challenge your preteen/teen to grab a Bible verse instead and begin saying it repeatedly. Think about it. Meditate on it.

### Ideas for Memorizing Scripture: High School

What works for preschoolers, elementary, middle school plus...

### **Mirror, Mirror**

Write the verse on a mirror with a dry-erase marker. Say the verse a few times each day and then erase one word from the verse. Keep doing this each day until you have erased all of the verse.

### **Use their Phone**

Make a screen saver with blanks for some of the words in a verse so they can memorize it. Or use an app like the YouVersion Bible app to encourage both reading the Bible and memorizing scripture. The Bible app even has a feature where it will read you the verse.

### **Memorization Flex**

We constantly see teenagers at the gym with their headphones on. If they want to memorize a verse, encourage them to listen to it while working out. They can build your spiritual muscles and their physical muscles all at the same time.

### **Different Lens**

Have them look at the verse in different translations in the YouVersion Bible app. Does looking at it through a different lens help you understand the meaning of the verse? (Also, don't forget the context when searching for meaning—read the verses before and after.)
