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Exodus 21:12-22:20

Kevin's sermon explores the concept of 'liminal spaces'—transitional periods in life where we are between who we were and who we are becoming. At Mount Sinai, God redefines the Israelites' past, present, and future, transforming them from slaves into a 'treasured possession, a kingdom of priests, and a holy nation.' This transformation mirrors our own spiritual journey, where we are called to receive and integrate our identity as God's chosen people, living out our faith in the world.

2. What does the term 'liminal space' mean to you, and how have you experienced it in your life?
3. Review today's Scripture passage. How does the story of the Israelites at Mount Sinai relate to your own spiritual journey?
4. In what ways do you feel God is transforming you during your current 'in-between' phase?
5. How can we better embrace our identity as a 'treasured possession' and 'kingdom of priests'?
6. How does understanding God's past actions in your life shape your present and future?

7. Why does it look like for you to integrate our identity in Christ into every aspect of our lives?
8. How can we support each other in our spiritual journeys, especially during times of transition?
