1. How did last week's lesson highlighting God as the loyal Covenant Keeper encourage you or shape your prayer life this week?

2. **Ruth 1:6-22** features a flurry of activity and emotion as Ruth the Moabite, her sister-in-law Orpah and her mother-in-law Naomi confront the decision of whether or not to return to Bethlehem. Pray for wisdom to recognize the significance of the choices presented. Make note of the decisions made by each woman.

3. In **V6-7**, what important news does Naomi receive and how does she respond? Why do you think she chose to do this?

4. Read **V8-10**, noting the Hebrew word for kindness is hesed. Describe the exchange between Naomi and her two daughters-in-law. What do we learn about Ruth and Orpah and their relationship with Naomi from these verses? 5. a) Naomi continues to urge Ruth and Orpah to return to Moab in V11-13. List the reasons she provides and comment on why they would be important considerations. b) What did Naomi conclude according to **V13b**? How does her conclusion resonate with you? 6. How do Orpah and Ruth's responses to Naomi differ and what is Orpah returning to according to **V14-15**? 7. Ruth the Moabite, a widow herself and a stranger to Bethlehem, makes a powerful declaration in V16-18. Summarize her statement and note any other biblical displays of faith and loyalty they call to mind. 8. How are the women welcomed in **V19** and why do you think the townspeople might struggle to recognize Naomi?

10. **V22** marks Naomi's return to Bethlehem and to God's chosen people. Describe a time in your life when you experienced a need to return to God in order to be filled. What weighed on your heart as you made the choice to return?

Set against the backdrop of the time of the Judges when so many had turned away from God, the word return appears fifteen times in the book of **Ruth**.
