For background: Between the end of the Old Testament and the events in the New Testament, there had been no spokesperson from God (i.e., prophet) to the nation of Israel. Amid this silent period from God, we meet our first New Testament woman, Elizabeth.

3. a) What were Zechariah and the assembled worshipers doing in **V8-10**?

b) List some details that strike you in the way God answered Zechariah's prayer from **V11-13**.
4. Getting in the shoes of this mother-to-be, what in the angel's prophecy would have warmed her heart?

5. Comment on how Elizabeth and Zechariah would have been ready to receive the great blessing of parenting this unique son in light of **V6** and **V13**.

- b) Zechariah experienced a verbal seclusion (unable to speak) while Elizabeth experienced a physical seclusion. How might God have been preparing each of them uniquely for what was to come?
10. What type(s) of “seclusion” do you feel would help or prepare you?
11. To whom and for what does Elizabeth credit her pregnancy? (**V25**)
12. Read **V26-38** with special attention to **V36-37**. Consider Elizabeth’s ongoing obedience in spite of her feelings of “disgrace.” For what impossible, barren, or “disgraceful” situation does she inspire you to remain obedient?

SECTION III: Read Luke 1:39-80

13. a) What happened to Elizabeth in **V39-41**?
14. As a result of being filled with the Holy Spirit, what insight has Elizabeth gained about:
- Mary? (**V42**)
- Mary’s Child? (**V42**)
- Elizabeth herself? (**V43**)
15. What did Elizabeth and John (though only a baby in her womb) both know and why? (See **V15b, V41b** and **V44**.)
16. As you read the events in **V56-63**, how does Elizabeth handle the situation?

17. According to **V64-66**, how did Zechariah and others respond?

18. As a result of being filled with the Holy Spirit, Zechariah bursts into prophetic praise. From **V67-80**, which verse do you love and why?

19. John, Elizabeth, and Zechariah were filled with the Holy Spirit. What do the following verses say about how someone today has the Holy Spirit living within them?
