4. a) According to **V19**, where was Pilate, and what strikes you about the timing when he received the message from his wife?
b) What truth about Jesus did she recognize? Take creative license; how do you think she may have suffered for Him in her dream?
5. a) Given the momentum of the Jewish leaders and the crowd, what character trait(s) do you see in Pilate's wife?
b) Whose ear do you have, and what message is the Lord asking you to deliver?
6. What happened in **V20-23**?
7. Read what took place in **V24-26**. Was Pilate truly "innocent of this man's blood"? Why or why not?

SECTION II: Read Acts 24

8. a) What event was under way in **V1-9**? Identify those who were involved, and their roles.

b) What were the accusations leveled against Paul in **V5-6**?

9. Read **V10-21** as Paul gave his defense against these accusations.

a) What evidence did Paul give that shows the case against him was not legitimate? (**V10-13 & 17-18**)

b) What did Paul admit to believing in **V14-15**?

c) From **V21**, what did Paul see was the real reason he was on trial? (For more detail, see **23:6-11**.)

10. What did Felix do after he heard Paul, and what orders did he give in **V22-23**?

11. a) From **V24a**, who accompanied Felix, and what do you learn about her?

b) According to **V24a-25b**, what truths were Drusilla and Felix exposed to?

12. a) What can you surmise about Felix's character from his responses in **V22-27**?

b) Have you ever given similar responses, or like Paul, have you received them? Explain.

13. What can you possibly deduce about Drusilla as you contrast how Pilate's wife responded to truth?
