b) Eunice, Timothy's mother, married a non-Jewish man. What are possible explanations for her marrying outside of her faith?
4. How did "the brothers" feel about Timothy in **V2**?
5. What two major decisions did Paul make concerning Timothy in **V3**?
6. a) Why was circumcision so important to the Jews?

b) Since his father was Greek (a non-Jew), Timothy wasn't circumcised. Read **Genesis 17:9-14**. What was the standing of a Jewish male who was uncircumcised?
7. a) According to **V4**, what was the mission of Paul and Timothy as they traveled from town to town?

b) Read **Acts 15:1-29** and describe the "decision" they delivered.

7. c) Why do you think Paul had Timothy circumcised, given the “decision” they were delivering?

8. From **V5**, how were the churches impacted?

9. Given that Eunice’s husband was likely not a believer, and yet Timothy had such a notable faith, what hope does this bring you?
