5. Write in your own words what you think motivated the bleeding outcast to fight the crowds and touch Jesus' cloak (**V27-28**).

6. As you put yourself in this woman's shoes:

- a) How and where have you felt like an outcast?

- b) In which ways have you had to go against "the crowd" in order to get closer to Jesus?

11. a) What do the following phrases from **V33** tell you about the bleeding woman?

- “came and fell at His feet”
- “trembling with fear”
- “told Him the whole truth”

- b) When have you come to Jesus in any or all of these ways?

12. What is the first word Jesus uses to address the woman? How might this be significant to her?

13. What do you think Jesus meant by "your faith has healed you"? Read **Hebrews 11:1 and 6** for further insight.
  
  
  
  
  
14. What additional blessings did Jesus give the bleeding woman in **V34b**, and what would they mean to her?
